Plateaux Gallery has opened on Lowndes Street, specialising in contemporary glass, resin and bronze sculpture. Inside you'll find a collection of glittering, prismatic pieces created by artists from around the world, displayed across a two-floor showroom which was converted from a shop into a gallery. Floor-to-ceiling mirrors reflect the artwork, while fitting rooms have become alcoves for spotlit sculptures.

The gallery is owned by glass art expert Leo Duval alongside married couple Bruce Denny and Tim Cohen. Bruce doubles as the gallery's resident artist, having abandoned careers in science and finance to become a full-time sculptor. He's always on-hand to talk visitors through the works on display and to advise on art placement – he can also be commissioned to create bespoke pieces specially for Plateaux clients.

The works sold in Plateaux are highly versatile, perfect for display in indoor or outdoor settings. The gallery also carries Bruce's "crystal clear" resin range, which has the visual impact of glass while coming in at a fraction of its weight, making it the perfect choice for yachts.
